Resolution No. 832-10 _____: “Supporting the efforts of a multijurisdictional recycling work group in evaluating the future of recycling in the Kanawha Valley, including the need for a regional recycling center to increase participation in recycling programs and to replace outdated and inefficient infrastructure; and supporting the group’s efforts to secure funding for the study and development of a new regional recycling center that will meet the future recycling needs of regional municipalities and counties.

WHEREAS, the City of Charleston is required by law to recycle; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Charleston expect a comprehensive recycling program; and

WHEREAS, the Kanawha County Solid Waste Authority’s Slack Street facility has reached the end of its productivity and cannot meet the region’s recycling needs; and

WHEREAS, a multijurisdictional working group was formed last year to apply for a planning grant that will finance the group’s evaluation of the region’s future recycling needs, including where a new facility and satellite facilities should be located, a transportation plan, what materials should be accepted, capacity and design of new facilities, and other related details leading to a comprehensive regional recycling plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of Charleston supports the efforts of the multijurisdictional recycling working group and Regional Development Authority in seeking federal Economic Development Authority funds for a planning grant;

Now, therefore, be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Council of the City of Charleston supports the efforts of a multijurisdictional recycling work group in evaluating the future of recycling in the Kanawha Valley, including the need for a regional recycling center to increase participation in recycling programs and to replace outdated and inefficient infrastructure; and supports the group’s efforts to secure funding for the study and development of a new regional recycling center that will meet the future recycling needs of regional municipalities and counties.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

Section 1. Two metered vehicular parking spaces for exclusive use of the physically disabled, from 6 am to 6 pm, on the easterly side of Capitol Street from a point 112 feet south of Washington Street to a point 156 feet south of Washington Street are hereby established.

Section 2. In order for a physically disabled person to utilize the parking spaces provided in the previous section the vehicle which they are driving or in which they are being transported must display the distinguishing insignia provided for in West Virginia Code, Chapter 17C, Article 13, Section 6.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle not displaying the insignia provided for in Section 2 to park in those spaces for the disabled provided for in Section 1. Any vehicle in violation of this section may be ticketed and impounded as provided for in Chapter 31, Vehicles and Traffic Law, Code of the City of Charleston, West Virginia.

Section 4. The Traffic Control Map and Traffic Control File, established by the Code of the City of Charleston, West Virginia, two thousand and three, as amended, Traffic Law, Chapter one hundred fourteen, Article five, shall be and hereby are, amended to conform to this Ordinance.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle not displaying the insignia provided for in Section 2 to park in those spaces for the disabled provided for in Section 1. Any vehicle in violation of this section may be ticketed and impounded as provided for in Chapter 31, Vehicles and Traffic Law, Code of the City of Charleston, West Virginia.
