### Resolution No. 957-11

WHEREAS: Brooks Manor Apartments, is located at 23 Brooks Street in Charleston, a half block from the local regional transportation system, three blocks from a major hospital facility, within two block from West Virginia's largest art and cultural center and within blocks of several churches and faith-based organizations; and

WHEREAS: Owned by West Virginia Homes, a non-profit corporation, and operated by National Church Residences of Columbus, Ohio, this facility provides low cost HUD-subsidized living for 57 of Charleston's senior citizens who

cannot afford costly apartment living; and

WHEREAS: The State of West Virginia has one the highest median age populations in the United States and one of the largest percentages of Senior Residents; and

WHEREAS: Since it opened in 1970, Brooks Manor Apartment has provided decent housing with a dedicated three-person staff and met all HUD requirements/standards for a 40 year old facility, and yet, as an aging building, it needs to be renovated to bring it up-to-date with current standards; and

WHEREAS: The West Virginia Homes volunteer Board of Directors has developed a plan to seek HUD grant funds to initiate the renovation process, and HUD has opened the grant application process for letters and other expressions of support from among community leaders and agencies in support of the renovation.

Therefore be it resolved by The Council and Mayor of The City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That we, the Members of Charleston's City Council support The Brooks Manor Apartments in their effort in seeking funds to begin the much-needed renovation and expansion project.

With a majority of members elected recorded thereon as voting in the affirmative the Mayor declared Resolution No. 957-11, adopted.

## **PUBLIC SAFETY**

Councillperson Will Hanna, Chairperson of the Council Committee on Public Safety , submitted the following report.

1. Your Committee on Public Safety has had under consideration Bill 7462, as amended, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that the bill do pass as amended.

Ordinance No.7462 - A Bill to revise and amend Charleston City Code, Section 10-163(b) by changing the number of days an impounded animal must be held at the Kanawha-Charleston Humane Association prior to the owner forfeiting the animal to the Humane Association from ten days to five days in order to bring the ordinance into compliance with the number of days a dog must be held from other jurisdictions and reduce the likelihood that the animal will become sick and have to be euthanized.

WHEREAS, historically, the City has established ordinances, currently in Chapter 10 of the City Code (the "Animal Ordinance"), regulating, among other things, the licensure, care, and humane treatment of such animals (including domestic dogs and cats) within

the City; regulating against such animals being left roaming at-large, creating noise disturbances, and other such nuisances which impact upon the health, safety, and welfare of those living in and visiting the City; and creating restrictions regarding the keeping of known vicious dogs;

WHEREAS, the Kanawha/Charleston Humane Association (the "Humane Association"), by its very nature of business, has direct and extensive experience in dealing with and caring for animals, including domestic dogs and cats;

WHEREAS, the current requirement to hold an animal for 10 days is in conflict with the length of time the Humane Association is required to hold animals from other jurisdictions, and;

WHEREAS, holding animals for an extra 5 days is causing more animals to become sick from upper respiratory infections and other diseases, and also causes more animals to have to be euthanized because of lack of cage space,;

WHEREAS, the Humane Association and the City agree that the Animal Ordinance can be made a more effective tool by amending and modifying the provisions relating to the number of days an animal must be held prior to forfeiture;

Therefore, Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia: That the Council of the City of Charleston hereby revises Charleston City Code, Section 10-163(b) by changing the number of days an impounded animal must be held at the Kanawha-Charleston Humane Association prior to the owner forfeiting the animal to the Humane Association from ten days to five days in order to bring the ordinance into compliance with the number of days a dog must be held from other jurisdictions and reduce the likelihood that the animal will become sick and have to be euthanized to read as follows:

Sec. 10-163. - Impounding, redemption and disposition.

(a)

A dog found running at large within the corporate limits of the city contrary to the provisions of section 10-161 may be impounded at the humane association by a humane officer or police officer. The humane officer or police officer shall make a record of all dogs so impounded with their description, date of impoundment and rabies vaccination number.

(b)

The owner of any dog impounded pursuant to the provisions of this article must appear and claim the said dog within ~~ten~~ five days from the date the dog is impounded. If the dog is not claimed within ~~ten~~ five days of impoundment, then the owner shall be deemed to have forfeited all interest in the dog and the dog shall be deemed abandoned. All interest in such dog shall vest to the humane association for adoption or other disposition. If the owner appears to

claim the dog within the five-day time period, said dog may be released to him or her upon the following conditions:

(1)

Proof that the dog is currently immunized against rabies, or, in the absence of such proof, reimbursement to the humane association for a rabies vaccine or voucher for a rabies vaccine;

(2)

Reimbursement to the humane association for all reasonable expense for necessary medical care;

(3)

Payment of the following fees to the ~~human~~ humane association:

a.

Impoundment and initial board fee for the first 24-hour period or any part thereof of \$30.00;

b.

An additional fee of \$5.00 for each additional 24-hour period up to a maximum of five days.
